When Mount Rainier erupts, Madison (aka Maddy), a Seattle climate activist and app developer who suffers from eco-anxiety must confront long-held guilt over her father's death, and put her new app to the test, to save a family of four in the midst of an apocalyptic nightmare.

WHY IT MATTERS

This is every Seattleite's worst nightmare. What would happen? Who would survive? And, how would it all go down? This feature allows us to confront our fears about climate change, and ourselves, in the face of imminent disaster.

SYNOPSIS

It's Washington State 2030. Meet a national park ranger in Paradise. An app developer in Seattle. And, a father of three in Orting – each trying to navigate what the future means for them.

Then, news arrives that Mount Rainier is about to erupt. Imminent death is upon those closer to the scene. The park ranger risks her own life to evacuate visitors from Mount Rainier National Park. The father must protect his family and escape Orting before it's too late. And, Maddy must overcome paralysis and put her new app to the test.

Will each of them make it out alive? Or, suffer the fate of Pompeii? And, what does the future hold for those who survive?
